## Safeguarding – both children and vulnerable adults

## NACCC Safeguarding Policy Statement

NACCC believes that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind and recognises it has a responsibility in safeguarding the welfare of all children and young people by being committed to promoting a practice that protects them.

NACCC recognises that:

- The welfare of the child is paramount;
- All children regardless of age, gender, disability, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual
- orientation or identity have the right to equal protection from all types of harm and abuse:

abuse;

- Working in partnership with children, parents, carers, and other agencies is essential in promoting children's welfare.
- The purpose of the policy is to provide protection for all the children who receive NACCC services, and to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child may be experiencing or be at risk of harm.
- NACCC will issue to each centre a 'Step by Step Guide' aimed at helping volunteers who may have concerns about a safeguarding issue.
- The NACCC policy applies to all staff, including Trustees, paid staff, volunteers, sessional workers, or anyone working on NACCC's behalf.

NACCC will endeavour to safeguard children by ensuring that all its staff, volunteers, trustees and member centres:

- Value and respect them;
- Adopt child protection and safeguarding guidelines through procedures and a code of conduct for all staff and volunteers;
- Recruit staff safely ensuring that all necessary checks are made which includes DBS, references, and induction training
- Share information about concerns with agencies who need to know;
- Share information relating to good practice with staff, volunteers, carers and children appropriately
- Encourage member centres to provide effective management, supervision, support and training for their staff and volunteers.
